[Environmental Racism](#) is the pattern of racism linking pollution and poverty. The poor and powerless most directly bear the burden and suffer disproportionately from the harmful effects of pollution. Causing greater incidence of asthma and toxic waste exposure in the poor. Nationally people of color bear a disproportionate burden of housing near waste sites. Spatial Racism is the term given to patterns of city development that isolate and segregate people geographically, specifically leaving the economic poor- mainly African Americans, Hispanic people, and new immigrants in deteriorating, impoverished areas. Spatial Racism creates a visible chasm between those who are rich and those who are poor, as well as between Caucasian people and people of color.
