 - Made reusable bags out of old t-shirts for members to take with them to grocery stores and cut down on plastic bag usage.
- Park clean up
 - Took a club outing to Harmon Park to pick up litter and trash.
- Plant holders
 - Created reusable plant holders out of used plastic water bottles.
